

It was the week we started Lent. I arrived at the office on Monday morning. My first order of business was to spend time in the sanctuary for prayer. There was a lot to share with God.

First, I prayed for an idea of what to write about in this newsletter article. Should I focus on Lent or Easter or some other topic? The deadline always comes up so quickly. Second, I gave thanks for a good weekend and a wonderful Sunday morning at St. John. Third, I prayed for our congregation. Please help certain members in need; let people have a meaningful Lenten Season. There was more in my communion with God, but you get the picture.

I went back to my office not knowing what to write in this newsletter article. Thus, I opened my devotional book for spiritual sustenance. The scripture text was from Colossians: "Be persistent in prayer, and keep alert as you pray, giving thanks to God." There was a story about a woman who was asked to pray for someone trying to find their pet snake. It had a good message. At the end of my reading, as I closed the book, I decided to write about prayer. That's fitting for this holy season.

As far as I know, all faith traditions pray. We pray in the Christian religion because Jesus prayed frequently to God. He gave us a model to follow in The Lord's Prayer. I believe it's important to note that there are two parts to The Lord's Prayer: one has to do with God and the other has to do with us. In essence, prayer is a conversation with God. This is a time to be in sacred union, to share honestly and openly with the Lord. We have an opportunity to develop our connection with the divine.

We can pray in a church sanctuary, in our homes, in nature. There is no specific place where we must pray; it should be a place where we are comfortable. Furthermore, there is no designated time of when to pray. We can pray with God at all hours of the day or night. Some of us like to fold our hands and close our eyes, while others may stand with arms opened wide looking up to the sky. Simply stated, I don't think there is a right or wrong way to pray, it's about being authentic in our relationship with the Lord.

If we are wanting to know what to talk about with God, then I think the five types of prayer are valuable. Praise is giving glory to God. This is our way of acknowledging the Lord's steadfast love and faithfulness in our lives. As one UCC pastor wrote, "We praise God, then, not only because we enjoy God, but in order that our joy may be complete." Confession is when we admit that we have not lived up to our best intentions. It's being truthful with us and God. I believe this is a humble and healthy attitude. A prayer of Thanksgiving expresses appreciation to the Lord for blessings and gifts. Since we have received such grace and goodness, we let God know how grateful we are for everything in life. Petition is an appeal for us. It may be asking for strength or help from the Lord. There is nothing wrong with requesting support in life. The fifth and final type of prayer is Intercession. We approach God to intercede on behalf of someone else. It might be for a friend struggling with health problems, or it could be an issue in our world.

I realize that some people pray because they believe God will intervene and answer prayers. My personal feeling is that the Lord doesn't arbitrarily choose what prayers to fulfill. I pray to God so that I might be changed through the experience of that moment. I pray so that I might be molded into being the disciple that Christ Jesus intends for me to be on earth. Whatever you decide, I hope prayer will be part of your spiritual life. May this message help you in your relationship with God and your faith journey this Lent.

FROM THE ST. JOHN CEMETERY BOARD




