

2024



Over the weekend, there was an assassination attempt on former President Donald Trump. It's, unfortunately, not a surprise considering the political tension and gun violence in our nation. I am deeply concerned as we move forward towards the Primaries and the Presidential election. We must denounce such horrific acts in our country. Let us all pray for civility in the political process and devote ourselves to peaceful behavior.

This got me to thinking about the political situation in our nation. I don't often venture into this area because I know just enough to sound foolish. Please permit me some latitude in revealing my foolishness.

There's been a lot of conversation, especially after President Joe Biden's debate performance, about the age of our two Presidential candidates. Some people question the cognitive ability to serve in this demanding role at an advanced stage in life. I am not qualified to determine whether there is a particular age at which someone is or is not mentally capable of serving as a leader; at the same time, I do believe that more elected officials are hanging on when they should step down. We only need to look at Mitch McConnell and Dianne Feinstein to recognize that too many politicians are unwilling to graciously conclude their service. It's like an athlete who doesn't know when to retire. (On a side note, retirement doesn't mean that a person is put out to pasture. Retirement ought to be an opportunity to volunteer and to make a difference in a new way. Look at Jimmy Carter teaching Sunday School and working with Habitat for Humanity.)

I think politicians who remain in office too long hurt our democracy. For one thing, when leaders are in positions for 20, 30, and 40 years, then they become so entrenched in the political system that it tends towards rigid ideologies and polarization. Second, when elected officials stay in office too long, then it unconsciously communicates the message that we have no new leaders, no fresh people, no one else who can guide our country. I consider how that appears to a younger generation and to other world leaders. It doesn't reflect highly on the United States.

My personal belief is that such positions – Senators, Members of the House, Supreme Court Justices – ought not be a lifelong career. I think we need to have term limits for all these positions. If Congress knew they only had a certain amount of time in office, then they might get something accomplished rather than holding out for their personal ideologies. Leaders seem more interested in re-election and agendas than addressing problems that impact our nation. There's certainly someone much smarter who could argue why terms limits wouldn't work, but how will we ever know if we don't try.

There was a different ending to this article. After submitting my message, we received news that President Biden would not continue as a presidential candidate. I am grateful that he has come to terms with his situation and that he will conclude his service. Even though we have heard it said many times already, that is a sign of patriotism. Biden is putting country over his own self-interest. I still believe Trump ought to do the same. For those who were concerned about Biden, if Trump wins, then he will be older than Biden is now when he finishes his term. Sadly, though, I can't foresee that happening. It's hard to convince a 'cult of personality' to do what's right and what's faithful for the whole.

As we move forward in the months ahead, I pray for peace to prevail, and I will do my best to be civil during this process. I hope that all of you will join me in doing the same.



The Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall air conditioning and heating project has been completed. I would like to thank all of those individuals who gave of their time and talents during this project.
