

I know this may seem early for the stewardship campaign; however, I learned from mentors long ago that stewardship is 365 days a year.

A pastoral colleague and I were talking once about church finances. The pastor shared with me that they didn't get involved with money matters; they left financial stewardship and the church budget up to lay leaders in the congregation. Numbers weren't "their thing," so they stayed out of it. He quoted the 1 Timothy passage: "The love of money is the root of all evil." When I asked about meeting budget and affording him, his response was, "If they can't pay me, then I'll move on." That sounded awfully callous.

Pastors and parishioners tend to hold a wide variety of perspectives on finances in relation to faith. Perhaps that's because the Bible has a lot to say about money, and those scripture texts often contradict each other. For instance, Proverbs 30 states: "Trusting God leads to prosperity." We like to believe that our wealth comes from being faithful to the Lord. On the other hand, Matthew 6 tells us, "Store riches in heaven, not earthly possessions." We should be focused on divine matters rather than worldly pursuits. I could continue to quote passages, but hopefully you get the point.

During my pastoral ministry, I've always been engaged in the finances of the church. For example, I write a newsletter article and preach a stewardship sermon every year. Maybe it's to fulfill that childhood interest I had in becoming an accountant. At the same time, I'd like to believe administrative ministry is a gift of mine. But most of all, I want to see the church flourish, and therefore, I want to do my best to ensure that things go well.

In 2023, the congregation approved a deficit budget for the year. Thanks to your generosity, St. John was able to finish strong with income over expenses. We also approved a deficit budget for 2024. As of the August financial report, we are ahead of projections. My sincere gratitude for your giving, and may we keep this momentum going for the remainder of the year.

Does this article or my involvement make a difference? Is that why our finances are healthy? None of us will ever know. I'd rather not leave it up to chance, though, nor do I think it's faithful to place all the burden on our leaders. It's important that we work together and keep vigilant about this Godly matter that has been entrusted to us. Being deliberate in our financial stewardship makes a difference.

The United Church of Christ stewardship theme this year is 'Imagine Together.' It's interesting that there is no scripture text associated with the theme. That'll grant me flexibility when I preach on Pledge Sunday. The materials we received offered this message: "Together, God calls us into community. The spiritual practice of generosity arises from imaging all that the Lord calls us to do as followers of Jesus. Our giving to the church makes it possible to turn what we imagine into reality."

I hope that we will hold fast as a body of believers, that we will stay united in our mission for Christ. This means "Imagining Together," working with one another, and engaging each other in the faith. Please join me in this ministry of stewardship and let's be intentional about our giving and our service for 2025.




VOLUNTEERS NEEDED
