






BIBLE STUDY

In the span of one month, we will move from a permanent staff model to a transitional period. I recognize the grief that comes from saying goodbye to staff members and those meaningful relationships. It's especially difficult in the church where we share sacred moments of our lives with each other. The uncertainty of everything may cause people to feel anxious or concerned. That's completely understandable. Even though I can't do anything about the departure of staff members, I hope to communicate a word that will put people at ease about the transition time.

The first area of ministry is music. There are a few pieces to this interim time. I am pleased to announce that Bruce Carvel, who is part of our choir, has agreed to direct both the sanctuary and bell choirs during this period. He brings a wealth of knowledge and experience that will help us maintain continuity. That is a tremendous relief.

The second portion is the church musician. Judy Lindquist has stepped forward to coordinate musicians for Sunday worship. Furthermore, she has secured Kelly Lashley (a St. John member) and Bob Meinz as additional musicians to play for worship services. Judy will develop a rotation to ensure that we have a capable person from week to week.

The final piece is the hiring process for a new person(s). Our Personnel Team is reviewing the job description(s) and planning for the search. I don't know if this will be one person or two staff members. The Personnel Team won't know until they receive resumes and begin interviewing candidates. I am confident, though, with who we have in place during the interim period.

I move now into the Associate Pastor position. This is a ministry area being reexamined by leadership. Based on conversations with appropriate people, the Church Council voted to have the Personnel Team revise job descriptions and propose a different staff model for St. John. When we have more information, this will be communicated to the congregation.

During the transition, we will need to help the Board of Christian Education in carrying out the programs that nurture our children and youth. We have extremely dedicated members in this area, but they are overextended and can only do so much. Maybe we need to pay someone, if such a person exists, to make phone calls, organize schedules, prepare materials and supplies, to support the ministry at this time. I want to make sure our young people receive the care that they deserve.

As for clergy responsibilities, I will do my best in responding to pastoral concerns, visits, and crises. Should I need to take a respite from worship and preaching, I will call on guest preachers to fill the pulpit. I will try to be faithful in serving as a resource to groups, as well as be present at events. May the good Lord guide my steps.

Finally, there has been a lot of attention regarding worker shortage in our nation. The reasons are different between the church and the business world; however, the results are still the same. It's not easy to fill positions, so I don't know how long it will take. My prayer is that all of us will unite and remain true to the work of Christ in this season of transition. I trust the Spirit of God will go with us and lead us into a bright future.

Notes from the August 13, 2024 Council Meeting

Farewell Service for Pastor Tracey will be held on September 15, 2024. Reception will be held immediately after church service. Trivia Night will be held October 5, 2024. Workday will be held October 19, 2024.

HVAC is completed however there are some control issues that Dave will look into. The bill came in \$1,800 over original estimate. Dave will share the HVAC Project Funding with the congregation. We will make an effort this fall to solicit contributions to recoup as much of the Richter Fund as possible.

Ann & Patrice Picaud have been completing work on the WEB and it is ready for inspection for an Occupancy Permit. More information will be shared with the congregation.

WISE process is continuing. Kevin had a meeting with our liaison from the National Office Mental Health Network. Several have volunteered to be on the team but would like to include youth and someone from NAMI. Would like to meet with the team after September 1, 2024.

For the interim, Bruce Carvel will be directing the Sanctuary and Bell Choirs. Musicians will be Judy Lindquist, Bob Meinz, and Kelly Lashley. They are working on a rotation schedule for the week.

Personnel Committee has completed exit interviews with Tim and Pastor Tracey. The Council voted to have the Personnel Committee revise all job descriptions and propose a potential staff model for the future.

The HVAC Project for the Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall is completed. Questions have arisen regarding the funding of the project and where we stand financially. The table above shows contributions, transfers, and expenditures relative to the project, as of **July 31, 2024**.

- 1. Between November 2023 and July 2024, we received \$51,604.60 in contributions from members (including \$1,000 from the St. John Men's Brotherhood from the chicken dinner) for the HVAC project.
- 2. Expenditures for the project totaled \$211,604.60 (which includes \$1,860.00 for additional scope of work, i.e., asbestos abatement and flooring repair).

Web Meeting June 8, 2024

Dave Gaehle led the meeting. Attendance was around 30-40. It was stated that the Council/the Picauds were presenting an idea regarding updating the WEB to transform it back into a usable property. They were interested in completing this proposal because it would benefit the church as well as the Picauds as the exchange of work for being allowed to live in the residence frees up funds for the family who have two children starting college. It was stated during the meeting that the church is not

planning to rent this house out to different people. St. John has no interest in being a landlord for rental property purposes. This is a cost-effective approach to improving the house so that the church can use it in the future for housing a pastor or other staff member of the church.

The Picauds would, under council supervision, effectuate repairs and remodeling to the WEB over the next 4-5 years in return for being able to rent the space while performing the repairs.

All agreed that the WEB is an asset to the church. The cost savings in labor by having the Picaud family perform these repairs is significant. The church would fund the materials for the work, but the work will largely be performed by the Picauds, which greatly, by about half, reduces the overall costs of rehabbing the house. Patrice Picaud is a trained master carpenter and is also trained in general construction. He and Ann, with the approval of Dave and the Council, would be working on completing these projects. The Picauds would also be responsible for maintaining renters' insurance while in the property and also paying for all utility usage.

The plan is to get the WEB into working condition to pass the occupancy inspection needed to be completed by the City of Manchester. This will be completed in the coming weeks. Once occupancy inspection is completed, the Picauds would move into the WEB and continue to work on remodeling projects on the bathrooms, basement and main floors of the WEB. There will also be a kitchen remodel in the future as well as outdoor upgrades in the form of landscaping.

Currently, an electrician has performed all the necessary electrical repairs that are known to bring the property to code. The plumber has also been on the property and found/repaired several leaks, installed a new ADA height toilet in the main floor bathroom and reestablished a water connection to the second floor that was being routed through the radiators. Howard Anton has worked to get the boiler up and running and on the AC unit so that there is working AC. And there have been two window units purchased to provide AC on the second floor.


