The annual meeting of the congregation of St. John United Church of Christ Manchester will be held on **Sunday, January 26, 2025 at 10:45 am**. The budget for 2025 will be presented and council members will be installed at this meeting. If you have any

The season of Advent is here. This is the beginning of a new church calendar for Christians. We often talk about January 1st as being the New Year in our world and Rally Day in August as the new program year for our local congregations, but Advent is the start of the new calendar year for our faith.

In the season of Advent, we anticipate the birth of our Lord Jesus. This is an exciting and holy time for Christians. There are many traditions used in the church to help focus our attention and to prepare our lives for this good news. These practices are filled with spirit and meaning. One of those traditions is the hanging of the greens. Thus, on **Saturday, December 7th**, we will decorate our church with the symbols of this season. We will put up the trees, drape garland, and create a sacred space for the holidays.



Advent is always full of fellowship events for people. There seems to be some activity every weekend. On **Sunday, December 8th**, people are invited to stay after worship for the Advent Breakfast in Fellowship Hall (formerly known as the Angel Breakfast). Besides food, crafts will be available for young people. Then on **Saturday, December 14th**, we have two fellowship activities for folks in the congregation. In the morning, people of all ages can go out caroling for our homebound members. That afternoon, the J.O.Y. (Just Older Youth) group will host their annual Ugly Christmas Sweater party. These are simply a few opportunities to get involved and to prepare us for the coming of Christ.

Worship is central to us as Christians. We are getting ready now for the variety of services being offered. The Children's Pageant will be on **Sunday, December 15th** – the Third Sunday of Advent. We will have our children and youth tell the Christmas story from the Bible. On the Fourth Sunday of Advent, **December 22nd**, we will celebrate the season with our Christmas Cantata. The service of music will have our choir singing "Star of Love," which will include a string quartet.

When December 24th arrives, my hope and prayer is that people will be brimming with joy for the birth of our Savior. I also hope and pray that folk will make worship of our newborn King, preferably in person, a priority. It seems with each passing year that family parties and other festive gatherings overshadow the light and life of Christ. Have this be the year that you join with the community in singing carols and praising Immanuel – 'God with us.'

On **Christmas Eve**, St. John will have a **5:00 p.m.** family service. The plan is to read "The Nativity" illustrated by Julie Vivas and to share the holy story through symbols from the Christmas stocking. The **7:00 p.m.** service will be lessons and carols by candlelight. It's a traditional worship experience that we haven't had in person since 2019. Both services will have communion and candles, as well as be online.

This is the most wonderful time of the year. We have joyous worship and fellowship for all ages. It's a chance to start the new Christian year with the grace and love of God in our hearts. I invite people to center their lives in this exciting moment. Give yourself the gift of faith and hope. There is nothing better for our soul than the birth of Christ our Lord.

Notes from the November 12, 2024 Council Meeting

Hanging of the Greens will be Saturday, December 7, 2024. Advent Pancake Breakfast will be Sunday, December 8, 2024 following the church service. Children's Christmas Pageant will be December 15, 2024 at the 9:30am service. Choir Cantata will be December 22, 2024.

After discussion the Council approved moving \$25,000 into the WEB account.

Dave Gaehle thanked all who helped with work day including the Scouts. Trying to locate original company regarding the sanctuary lighting for ordering replacement lights. Will continue monitoring HVAC for the winter.

WEB Status - The electrical work has been completed. Occupancy inspection on Thursday. Ann hopes to move in by Thanksgiving and obtaining rental insurance. Craig is working on lease agreement. In 2025 will be working on caps for fireplace chimney and starting on bathroom.

Craig Lindquist stated the Sausage Supper was successful serving approximately 240. Thanks to Dave Gaehle and John Jung for all their work.

Board of Christian Education only has three people on the Board. Chris Morton has dedicated people and everything is in place for teachers. Chris is going off the Board in January.

Personnel Update - Both positions were posted on several websites in addition to Washington University Music Department for the musician position. We posted the position for the Director of Education with the Association of United Church Educators. No responses.

Cedar Ford Timber Harvest - Letter was sent. No response. Will talk to the harvester to move ahead and stay out of the corner that is in question.

Discussion was held regarding a QR code to use for the church. After discussion the Council approved the QR code be put in the bulletin.

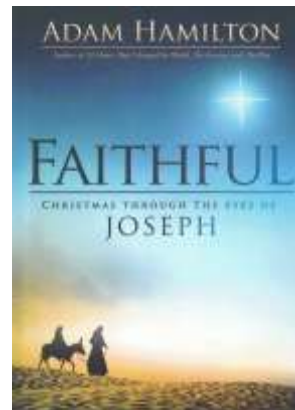


Adult Advent Study

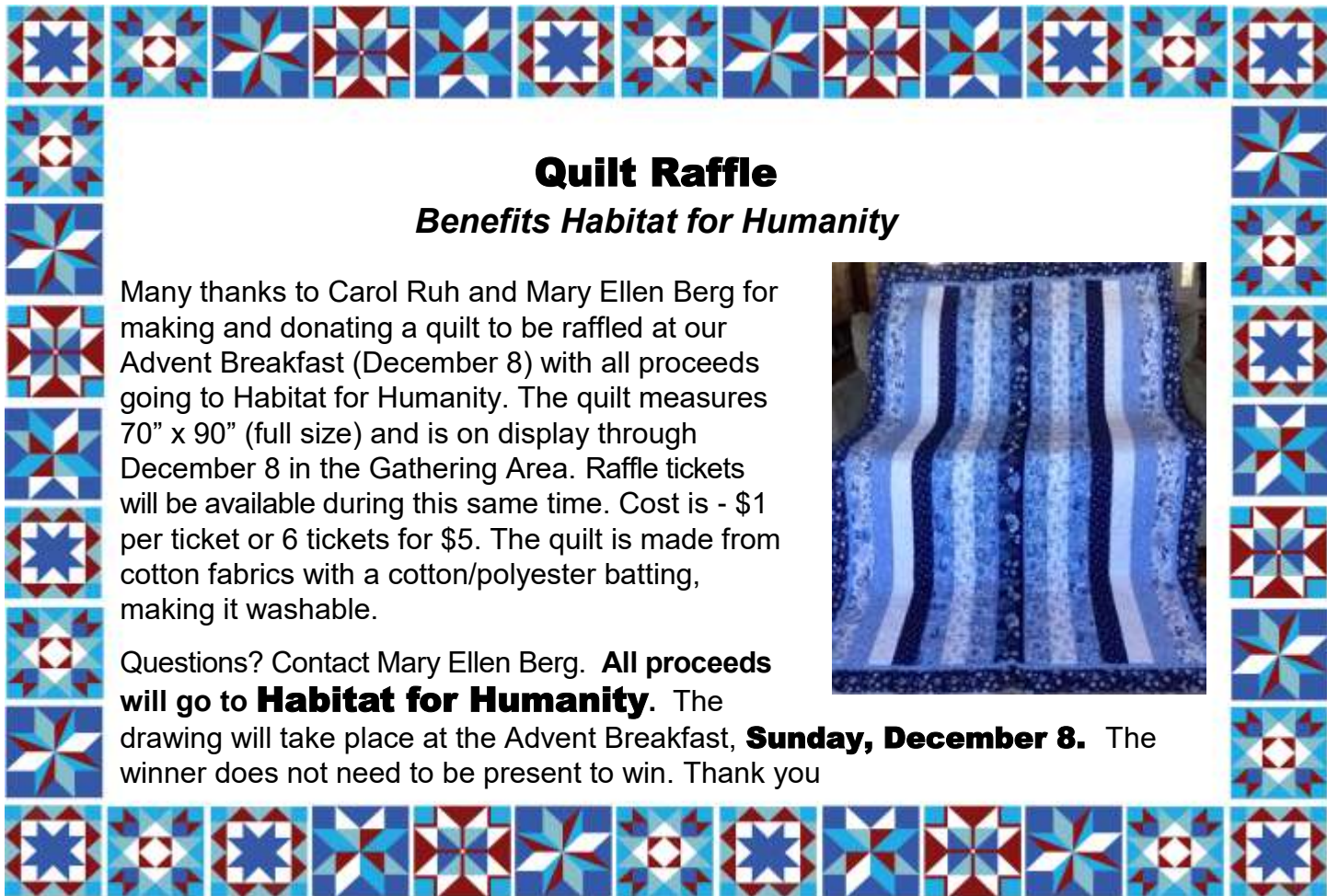
