The most meaningful time of the year – Holy Week – will be here soon. I have always found the varied worship experiences during this sacred week to be moving. Thus, allow me to share with you the services and events of Holy Week.

We begin with the celebration of Palm Sunday (April 13th). This is the service in which we hold a processional waving palm branches while the congregation shouts "Hosanna in the highest!" After worship, we will have our egg hunt for children, as well as a pancake breakfast in the Fellowship Hall. The purpose is to unite the congregation as we enter this sacred week.



We will join again for worship on Maundy Thursday (April 17th). This solemn event not only recognizes the Last Supper that Jesus shared with his disciples, but we also recall the agony of Jesus' betrayal by Judas Iscariot. In the Gospel of John, the focus is on Jesus washing the feet of his disciples. He also offers them a new commandment: "Love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another." That's where the word Maundy comes from; it's from the Latin word mandatum or mandate. Jesus mandates a new commandment.

On Good Friday (April 18th), we take our place at the foot of the cross. This worship experience, if we turn ourselves over to God, has the power to be deeply emotional. I find the somber hymns to be some of the most powerful music in our Christian tradition. We will hear the story and listen to the choir sing. As painful as it may be, and as difficult as it may be to understand, the death of Jesus on the cross is important to our faith for Easter to have any significance or truth in our lives.

One of my favorite quotes is by New Testament professor, Charles Cousar, who wrote: "A theology that rings loudly the joyful note of Easter without the sobering, dissonant sounds of Good Friday inevitably leads to triumphalism". Triumphalism – an attitude of power and dominance over others is not following the path of our humble, crucified Savior.

We will gather together for God's glorious victory over death on Easter (April 20th). We praise the Lord that suffering and death did not have the final word, but that Jesus Christ's resurrection grants us new and everlasting life. There are two services that morning: a sunrise experience at 7:00 am under the pavilion and a traditional worship experience at 9:30 am in the sanctuary.

For decades, the sanctuary has always been filled for Christmas and Easter. People had to arrive early and save seats. I have told staff and the Worship & Music Team that our attendance has been low on these two high holy days. Folk don't seem to be showing up for these services. I could take a couple of guesses, but that doesn't do any good. My hope is that people will make Holy Week and the worship of God a priority. Should you do that, may you experience the true joy of Easter and the new life of our Christian faith.




TEA WITH FRIENDS
