

Greg Dreisewerd Lily Gregory Ashleigh Martin This month is Mental Health Awareness. That means we observe and emphasize mental wellbeing in our communities. It's been happening since 1949. Thus, I would like to take this opportunity to highlight what we've done since the establishment of our WISE Team, as well as where we are going in our ministry.

As you may recall, W.I.S.E. is an acronym for Welcoming, Inclusive, Supportive, and Engaged. The purpose is to be a congregation that encourages individuals and families living with mental health challenges. What is mental health? According to The World Health Organization,



mental health is "a state of wellbeing in which the individual can cope with the normal stresses of life, can work productively and fruitfully, and is able to make a contribution to their community."

Why is that important? First, Jesus regularly reached out to people (e.g. Jesus heals the Gerasene Demoniac) dealing with issues of mental health. Our Lord believed that all people are children of God and ought to be treated with dignity and respect. He wanted to help people be healthy and whole in body, mind, and spirit. Second, the statistics reveal that 1 in 5 Americans experience a mental health condition. This can be depression and anxiety or an eating disorder or a personality disorder or a trauma-related event. It's imperative that the community of Christ journey with people on these difficult roads. We must let individuals and families know that they are not alone and that the church cares deeply.

The WISE Team has been meeting each month to lead our congregation through this process. (Members: Karen Benton, Randy Engelhardt, Sandi Frandsen, Rev. Don Frandsen, Jaclyn Morton, Jeannette Musgrave, and myself.) We started with a mental health survey for the community. Thanks to everyone who filled out a form! Jaclyn surveyed our youth group and peers at her high school. The information gathered is helping us develop ways to connect with the congregation.

In March, we hosted a first aid training for mental health facilitated by the National Council for Mental Wellbeing. There were 14 members who gathered for an all-day session to learn about the ALGEE action plan for mental health. ALGEE stands for: Approach the situation, Listen nonjudgmentally, Give reassurance and information, Encourage appropriate help, and Encourage other support strategies. For those who would like to know more, manuals have been placed in the Hospitality Room for people to peruse.

There are a few things that the WISE Team is intending to implement. Beginning in May, we are partnering with the Green Team to start a walking group. Please read the announcement in the newsletter and bulletin. Folks have found nature and exercise to be a healthy initiative to strengthen mental wellbeing. In addition, we plan to have a designated section in our Friendly Call each month to share reliable facts and resources.

The Team is also looking ahead to a book study. We want to offer small group settings for people to read and to participate in conversations around mental health. Furthermore, there is the hope of working with the behavioral health systems in our area to hold a "lecture series," where we have professionals speak on various topics related to mental health. The point of this ministry is to overcome the stigma surrounding mental health and to engage in supportive relationships. After all, I believe this is what God is calling us to do through our Christian faith. May we take this opportunity to equip ourselves as WISE servants of our Lord and Savior.




WALK AT SCHROEDER PARK


Nolan Zink
